President's Message

January 2011

We have been maintaining our effort to increase communication within the Glen Eagle community. Our recent experience with some owners has been encouraging, when we are able to work together with mutual courtesy and respect, most situations are resolved. We also plan on continuing the mailings that we have sent out over the past few months to help keep everyone informed and to provide helpful suggestions.

We have instituted the first level courtesy letter just to inform owners as an initial reminder; this has worked well so far and we have received several compliments for this approach. All this requires a lot of involvement from the board members and the current board is spending a lot of direct time with owners to work through potential issues without recourse to prior methods; we appreciate everyone's cooperation as fellow neighbors.

We are currently working on several items on behalf of the neighborhood. One very important item we are working on is a "Reserve Analysis" to ascertain if the level of the reserve fund of the Association is adequate or below what it should be, this item has direct financial consequences for the Association and to our knowledge it has never been done before. We are also investigating lawn care options, as the water supply in Florida becomes more of a problem for everyone in the state. In addition, we recognize that another year of severe cold weather has taken its toll on the lawns and everyone will be working hard on restoring the lawns back to good condition, we hope to provide suggestions that may be of some help.

Another item we will be investigating is the possibility of a local vendor for the mailboxes that would have more reasonable pricing and better availability of equipment and service. We are also updating and streamlining the Design Standards Manual, the Architectural Review Board has been spending a lot of their personal time to review all the items for reasonableness and consistency.

The goal was to provide better guidelines for everyone with a spirit of cooperation; our core belief is that everyone in the community wants to maintain a great outward appearance to their house and property without threat or fear of punitive action. Please contact the board or the Architectural Review Board if there are any questions or comments. Best wishes to everyone in this new year and we look forward to working with everyone in the coming year.

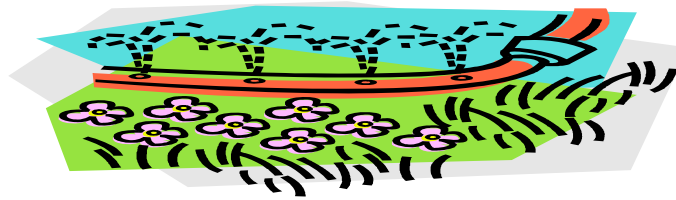

WATER CONSERVATION IN WINTER SPRINGS

Now that we are back to standard time for the winter, the City of Winter Springs irrigation ordinance allows for one day of irrigation per week rather than two. I don't know if you have published a reminder in your HOA newsletter, but a Glen Eagle resident who has participated in our water conservation program mentioned I might send information to the HOA regarding the watering restrictions and our water conservation program. The City of Winter Springs Water Conservation Program seeks to help residents lower their monthly water use and save money on their utility bill. As part of the program we offer free irrigation audits. The audits involved inspecting the water meter, irrigation timer, and sprinkler heads to make sure the system is functioning as efficiently as possible. We provide information on establishing run times for each zone to provide the recommended amount of water, how to improve the efficiency of your irrigation, choosing landscaping best suited for our area, and more. We recently had a water saving shower head giveaway and will have other similar events throughout the year. We offer free faucet aerators and toilet flappers to help residents conserve water. Residents who are interested in having an audit conducted, have questions concerning water conservation, or are interested in free water saving devices can contact me.

Recipe Corner

Awesome Shrimp Scampi

Scampi Butter

- 1-2 cloves garlic (chopped fine)
- ½ T. Shallots (chopped)
- 1 Lemon (ground fine including rind and pulp)
- ½ t. Freeze dried chives
- 1 Saw Worcestershire sauce
- ¼ t. Salt
- 1/8 T. garlic Salt
- 1 Stick of butter softened (4 oz.)

SHRIMP

- 6 Jumbo shrimp
- ½ cup fresh breadcrumbs
- Sherry

SCAMPI BUTTER

1. Process all ingredients in blender or food processor (or chop very fine) Add to soften butter. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use

SHRIMP

1. Lightly bread damp shrimp and place in baking dish. Melt one third of the scampi butter and pour over shrimp evenly.
2. Bake in hot oven 475 for 8-10 minutes for until done. Cover with sherry.

Serves two - enjoy
