## **NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT**

A Happy and Healthy 2010 to all the members of the Glen Eagle Homeowners Association! I for one am glad to say good-bye to 2009! However our community had a few significant events in 2009 that have and will continue to improve our infrastructure. We had the remaining roads of our development repaved. The Board addressed the high maintenance cost of our Northern Way entrance's twin lights by contracting for more cost effective lights and placing one in a central illumination location, reducing electrical consumption by 50%. There was a great deal of effort spent on creating community entrances with more "curb appeal" regarding floral and landscaping arrangements. This was achieved mid 2009 and will continue on with our new landscaping contractor – P&L. P&L replaced Superior Lawn Services on January 1, and we look forward to a great relationship with them!

Thanks to our Social Committee for an eventful 2009! This was one of the best years our community has had sharing good times in recent memory and we look forward to it getting even better in this New Year.

As 2010 begins, your Board is working with the City of Winter Springs regarding the landscaping along Winter Springs Blvd (from the wall to the street). We're investigating the cost benefit of having this area maintained by the City, as opposed to our Association. If feasible, this could lead to significant savings in our annual lawn maintenance expense.

As an annual reminder, I'd be remiss if I didn't mention the excellent work our Architectural Review Board has

done and continues to do. So, to make their tasks somewhat easier to complete, please remember we live in accordance with our community documents and the ARB must be notified and approve changes before anything is done to your property. A good rule is to always ask and you'll get the answer that meets our Association's deeds and restrictions.

Finally, at the beginning of this New Year we find our community in good shape. We look forward to an even better 2010 with the hope, once again, that more and more of our community's residents feel compelled to get involved.
